   – Sum 24, Aug-Dec (fall), Jan May (spring)













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### Pierce College Updates

- Two peer mentors in MESA this spring
- Mentoring plans for fall:
  - Recruiting peer mentors for fall semester
  - Planning peer mentor training for this summer combination of existing Pierce Peerto-Peer Mentor training and MESA-specific training
  - One peer mentor lead (current peer mentor who is continuing) borrowing this model from CoC
- Pierce students applied to CSUN summer research







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### Updates for College of the Canyons:

- 1. We have established two specific peer mentors for our students.
- 2. Students have been involved in peer support group with our new mental health specialist to assist in the pressures of a first generation/underrepresented STEM student.
- 3. Our counselor has been meeting with our students to keep them on track as well as making sure our students stay on their path in STEM.
- 4. Overall students and faculty have been fostering the learning community established in MESA to support the academic and professional development of our student population.

- Selected students will be sorted to projects. We kindly asked faculty to submit a prioritized ranking by <u>May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024</u>.



#### DR. GINA ANN GARCIA

Dr. Gina Ann Garcia is a professor in the School of Education at UC Berkeley. Her research centers on issues of equity and justice in higher education with an emphasis on understanding how Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) embrace and enact an organizational identity for serving minoritized populations. She explores the experiences of administrators, faculty, and staff at HSIs and the outcomes of students attending these institutions. As an equityminded scholar, she tends to the ways that race and racism have shaped institutions of higher education.

pr. Garda is the author of Becoming Hispanic-Serving Institutions: Opportunities for Colleges & Universities for which she won the American Association of Hispanics in Higher Education Book of the Year Award in 2020 and the editor of the book Hispanic-Serving Institutions in Practice: Defining "Servingness" at HSIs. Her newest book, Transforming Hispanic Serving Institutions for Equity and Justice was released in Spring 2023 and is now available.

She has delivered over ISO public lectures and workshops across the country and consults directly with HSIs to work towards organizational transformation. She is also the host of the popular podcast ¿Qué pasa, HSIs? and founded the Cal HSI Center which advances HSI research that informs practice and policy.

Dr. Garcia graduated from California State University. Northridge with a bachelor's degree in marketing, the University of Maryland. College Park with a master's degree in college student personnel, and the University of California, Los Angeles with a Ph.D. in higher education and organizational change. She is a proud alumna of a HSI and was a Title V Coordinator at Cal State University. Fullerton which drives and motivates her research and praxis.

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






### Dr. Gina's Workshop
