I plan to continue my degree and apply for more research positions. I found that doing research is very fulfilling in many regards.








Undergraduate Research Program 2025 14 Proposals Received

Undergraduate Research Program 2025

• Students will be able to apply via Qualtrics between the beginning of December 2024 and the second half of February 2025. A workshop is planned for Feb 6th. We are currently working on producing the flyer.



• The received applications will be pre-screened to verify eligibility requirements, and then distributed to faculty who will interview and select their students (3 to 5 students).



• Students who are graduating in May are eligible, but with the condition that they have to present at the second edition of the research symposium, to be held in early Fall 2025.



• Selected students will receive official notification by March and two orientation events will be organized for faculty and students, tentatively in early April 2025.

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Peer Mentoring Program

- Summer 2025 Invite new transfer students into the program





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
